Program Note.

Instrumentation.

unamplified solid-body electric guitar

- must have a pick-guard
- must have round-wound strings. Not flat-wounds or ribbon-wounds.

plectrum (2) low-noise condenser microphone (ie. Rode NT-1A) PA system

Duration.

~5min

Technical notes.

The guitar is unamplified, meaning there are no cables connecting it to any guitar amplifier. The sounds are made audible by the use of a condenser microphone which is connected to the PA system used to play the tape (WAV).

The tuning of the guitar is DADFAD* (String 1 being a D quarter sharp)


The microphone should be placed very close to the guitar, enough so that the player's breathing is also captured on occasion. The microphone must be focused near the pick-ups, in order to amplify the quietest sounds – the scraping of the pick-guard.

In terms of levels, the sound of the microphone should be louder than the sound of the tape, a ration of 60/40.

Performance notes.



Use the side edge of the pick to hammer strongly, vertically downwards onto string 1, over the pickups. You may hit string 2 or 3 occasionally, which is ok.


Hit strings 6-4 at about the 7th fret over the fingerboard, allowing them to ring freely





Slowly transfer the plectrum from the left to right hands, beginning to use the flesh of the fingers to quietly tap the strings.


NOTE 3. Transfer pick to LH, and use flesh of the fingers to quietly tap strings




4. Tap the body of the guitar with the tip of the plectrum. Exact rhythms not imperative.



5. Using the tip of the plectrum, scrape around the pick-guard as smoothly as possible.




6. Run a finger up and down string 3, for a soft, speaking effect. Occasionally sound a harmonic (any accessible) by fretting using the LH and plucking with the RH.




NOTE 6. Run a finger up and down string 3 for a soft speaking-like effect.

7. Using all four RH fingers, scrape the inside of the $1/8^{th}$ inch jack using a tremolo motion.



8. Using the plectrum, scrape the bridge, altering speed with each scrape. Exact rhythms not imperative.

NOTE 8. Using the plectrum, scrape the bridge, altering speed with each scrape.


















NOTE 3. Transfer pick to LH, and use flesh of the fingers to quietly tap strings
